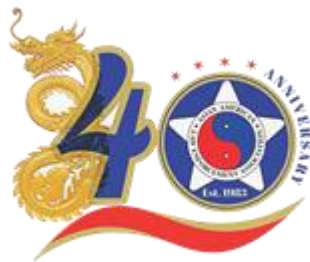
TROOPER CHONG SOO LIM SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

The Asian American Law Enforcement Association (AALEA) is honored to present the Trooper Chong Soo Lim Scholarship Award. Born in South Korea, Trooper Lim, also an AALEA Brother, patrolled District 3 in Chicago upon his graduation from the Illinois State Police Academy. He transferred to the midnight shift in District 15, Oak Brook and was killed in the line of duty on June 5th, 1995 when his patrol car was struck from behind as he made a traffic stop on the Northwest Tollway. His squad car was rear ended and burst into flames. Trooper Lim had stopped a car on I-90, near Hoffman Estates when a pick-up truck struck the rear of his vehicle and forced it into the vehicle in front of him. The force of the collision caused the gas tank to explode and trapped Trooper Lim inside of his vehicle. Trooper Chong Soo Lim was the first Asian officer killed in the line of duty in Illinois. This \$500 scholarship award to four qualified candidates (two from the community and two from families of current active AALEA members) was created in remembrance of Trooper Lim, who made the ultimate sacrifice in the performance of his duties. AALEA awards this scholarship in honor of our brother: Trooper Chong Soo Lim.

Criteria for Selection:

- The applicant must be Asian by birth or descendent.
- The applicant must submit a minimum 300-word essay on “**How to improve relationships between members of the community and Law Enforcement agencies.**”
- The applicant must be a high school junior or senior applying to an accredited college or be enrolled full time in a degree seeking program at a U.S. accredited college or university.
- The applicant must currently maintain a "B" average [3.00 GPA on a 4.00 scale] or higher, during his/her high school career.
- The applicant must submit a short biography with an attached photograph of the applicant.
- The applicant must submit a college acceptance letter and most recent report card with this scholarship application.
- A previous recipient is not eligible to apply.
